Dr. Chamberland:

Don Covell passed away on April 16, 2023 after a long battle with Multiple Myeloma. Don served as an Auburn High School custodian from 2004 until he retired in 2019. TEACHING AND LEARNING REPORT:

Alan Keller was not present, Dr. Chamberland read his report.

On the evening of April 12, Dr. Meghan McCoy offered a virtual presentation to Auburn families on bullying, cyberbullying and conflict. Over 30 people joined the presentation, which was recorded and shared with families. Dr. McCoy defined and highlighted trends of bullying, cyberbullying and conflict, and shared data on the increase in mental health needs, behavioral incidents and the rise in screen time since Covid. From there, Dr. McCoy shifted into what we can do as adults which included:

- Increase face-to-face time and reduce online interactions (screens in and of themselves are not bad; the problem is the activities that screens replace).
- Help our children become resilient—be models at home by showing how we deal with small bits of conflict. Small, manageable conflicts build our students' skills and teach them skills they will need when we are not there for them. Social skills are like muscles, the less we use them, the weaker we become. Similarly, the more we as parents jump in and solve issues, the less our children get this practice.
- Be models of social media.
 - Show our children how to do it right: in moderation, no technology at the dinner table and during family time; phones in a common place at night (never in a bedroom).
 - Teach your child about consent—don't post pictures of them without asking permission, so that they understand this concept as they grow.
 - Discuss "social media distortion" (the phenomenon where everything is wonderful and everyone looks perfect)

- Be aware of your signs of anxiety and depression in your child that include social isolation, lack of interest in areas they typically enjoy, or sadness that persists or worry that cannot be alleviated by logic)
- If you find that your child is being bullied, communicate immediately with the school.

Beginning tomorrow and for the next three weeks, Dr. McCoy will present to students at each of our schools on the concepts of relationships, conflict, bullying and cyberbullying. Her message is designed for each age group, with the goal being to help build our students skills in managing relationships and to identify ways that they can get or offer support in the case of conflict or bullying.
